An Open Letter to the Poor, Overtaxed and Unjustly Treated

To "Justice", Duncan, Okla.:

They are the fine gentry, class of the rich man, that have caused the shedding of all the human blood that has been shed on the earth, for the reason that they have been the rulers and teachers of all people that have ever lived on the earth, which makes them responsible for all human blood that has been shed on it. The sheep's clothing they wear is their pretensions of love and friendship they pretend to have for us. They have threatened us with eternal punishment by the devil in his hell if we did not believe and obey them, but have never been honest or truthful enough to tell us that the only devil that ever was or ever will be is the devil that dwells in them, and that the only hell that ever was or will be is the trouble, sorrow, moaning and suffering that they have inflicted on their ignorant own fellow man, which is and indeed has been as hot a hell as their mean wisdom could make it. Now, brethren, lookout and see what a plausible lie they can and will make to excuse themselves for trampling our constitutional rights under their feet. They know as well as we do that the founders of this republic positively forbid them or anyone else from interfering with them, but, hell, what do they care for us or our rights?

There would be no banks "busting up in business," no runs, no financial panics, no suspension of payments, no six days' holiday to recuperate (coup or recoup) and no need of laws in regard to interest, reserves, speculation, usury or extortion. There would be no more necessity for laws on these subjects than there is for laws in regard to carrying through mail on mule back from Duncan to New York, Chicago, San Francisco and New Orleans.

These governments would soon be employing every citizen able and willing to perform some useful service at wages just equal to the entire product of their labor. Every citizen would own a beautiful home, provided with all the comforts, conveniences and elegancies of a progressive civilization. Every child in growing to adult age would be given a first-class college education. In short, every citizen would have a good government position for life, and Morgan, Rockefeller, Carnegie, Harriman, et al. would not be in it unless they became useful wealth producers.

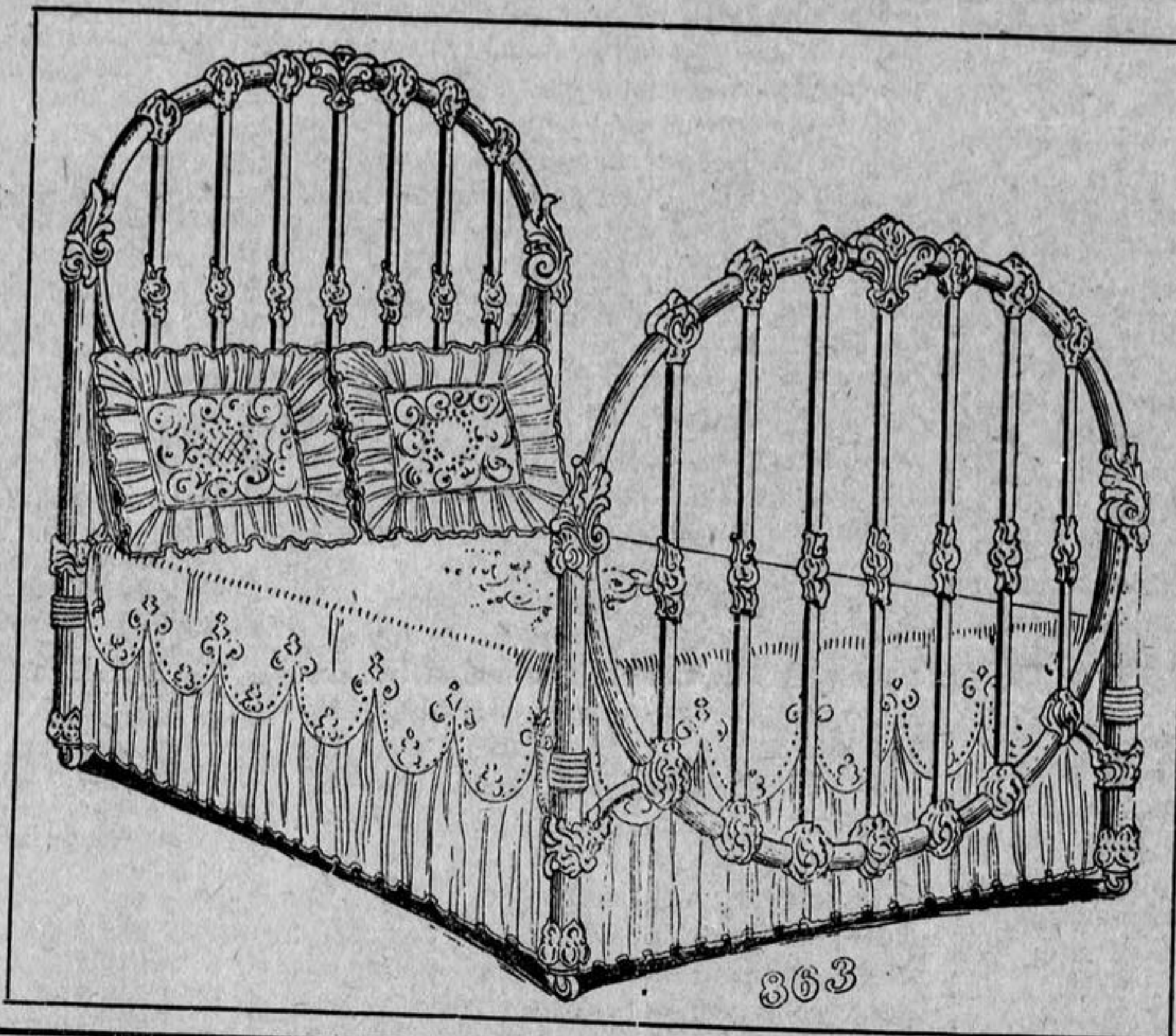

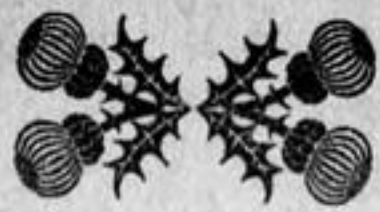

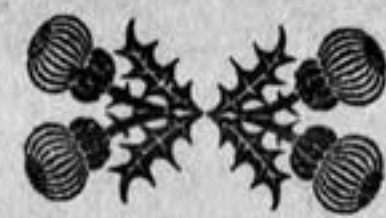
