Mr. Watson says that the "AP-PEAL TO REASON BELIEVES THAT THE ONLY DIFFER-ENCE BETWEEN A NEGRO AND A WHITE MAN IS THE HUE OF THE WRAPPER."-Did Mr. Watson offer any proof that the "Appeal to Reason" believes this? No, no, and why he did not was for the same reason that he offered no proof for any other of his absurd statements-HE COULDN'T.

The readers of the RIP-SAW are too familiar with its beliefs upon the negro question for us to make comment upon the subject, and the only reason that Tom Watson didn't include the RIP-SAW in his absurd statements, was because he knew the RIP-SAW circulated in every nook and corner of the United States, and that should he include the RIP-SAW, that his readers would too quickly tumble to the fact that his entire statements were made for no other reason than to prejudice his readers against the doctrines of Socialism.

The RIP-SAW does not believe that the negro as a race is equal to the caucasian race, NOR IT DOES NOT BELIEVE THAT IT EVER WILL BE; but the RIP-SAW knows that so long as the negro race enters into competition with the white race and uses its hands, AND THE SAME TOOLS THAT THE WHITE RACE USE TO EARN ITS BREAD AND BUTTER, that the negro race must be placed upon a "SOCIAL ECO-NOMIC EQUALITY" with the white race before the white race can ever forge to the front and reach the zenith of its greatness; for just as long as the negro and the tools with which he works are controlled by the MASTER CLASS, just that long he remains their slave; and so long as the negro remains the slave of the MASTER CLASS, just that long the white man will be pulled down to his level, as both the white man and the negro are compelled to make their living WITH THEIR HANDS AND USE THE SAME KIND OF TOOLS.

Mr. Watson forgot to tell you that the negro and the white man have lived in comparative peace side by side for fifty years, or since the negro ceased to be chattel property, and that in all of that time the MAS-TER CLASS have kept both the negro and the white man on an AB-SOLUTE ECONOMIC EQUAL-ITY, and that the negro has not under these damnable conditions degraded the caucasian race; and if he has not degraded the caucasian race under such conditions, then how could he degrade that race under conditions which reward SERV-ICE instead of SERVITUDE, as are the conditions to-day?

Mr. Watson asks in the article from which I am quoting, "HOW CAN SOCIALISM MAKE EOUAL THOSE WHOM GOD HAS MADE UNEQUAL?"-And by this question he has de-

clared that the white race is SU-PERIOR to the black race; and if such is the case and if these two unequal races have lived together for multiplied decades without the negro race degrading the caucasian race, then is it not natural to suppose that when an "ECONOMIC SOCIAL EQUALITY" is given both of these races that the caucasian race will leap far in advance of the negro race, his inferior? For at that time SERVICE will be the thing that will be rewarded; and if SERVICE instead of SERVI-TUDE is to be rewarded, and if as Mr. Watson says, the caucasian race is the superior race of the two, AND SUCH WE BELIEVE, then will not the caucasian race, under a Socialism that offers no reward only for SERVICE, leap to the front, and will not the negro race, according to Mr. Watson's own logic, sink in proportion to the advancement made by the caucasian race?

We are sorry that Tom Watson, in order to defend the MASTER CLASS, has found it incumbent upon his great intellect to resort to the cunning trickery of that class who has set astride the calloused neck of both the white and the black slave since time was young.

You must remember, Mr. Watson, that you are not talking to the same old public that you talked to fifteen years ago, as THOUGHT is becoming the mainspring that moves the world today, and not blind confidence in leaders who are blinded by their own interests.

Mr. Reader, I'll tell you what started Watson's Warblings; it was this: A Georgia railroad was operating its trains almost entirely with negro firemen, and this railroad was paying the negro firemen much less than it paid white firemen, which placed the negro in direct competition with the white man. The Socialist party, as we have stated before, believe in SERVICE being rewarded, and selected this Georgia railroad for a target to demonstrate to the world at large that it was not SERVICE that prompted that railroad to give the negro the firemanship of their trains; but that it was CHEAPNESS, as the negro firemen could be hired for less money than the white firemen, and the Socialist party made this so plain to the white employees of that Georgia railroad that both the white firemen and the engineers struck, and that Georgia railroad was tied up tighter than Pell, if you please, and it remained tied up to that degree of tightness until the officials of that Georgia railroad, through arbitration, agreed to pay the negro firemen the same wages that they pay white firemen; and as soon as that agreement was made, that Georgia railroad began dropping the negro firemen as fast as it could, and giving their jobs to white firemen. WHY? Simply because they have learned that they were going to have to pay for SERVICE, and they knew THAT WHITE MEN GAVE BETTER SERVICE

THAN BLACK MEN.

Tom Watson never touched upon a subject in all his life that was so prolific in showing up either his ignorance of the tenets of Socialism or his cunning, as the subject matter he used in trying to condemn Socialism condemned himself.

Another great reason prompted Mr. Watson to warble so sweetly was, as he said, IN THE SOUTH AND WEST, AS WELL AS THE NORTH AND EAST SOCIALISM IS GAINING CONVERTS. — - This worries Thomas E. Watson, and it worries every individual of the MASTER CLASS, as they realize that when SERVICE instead of SERVI-TUDE comes to be rewarded that their class will either render some service beneficial to humanity or starve; for at that time all men will do THEIR BEST in order to reap the BEST REWARD; and since the white man is SUPERIOR to the black man in every instance as a race, the white man will be so far removed above the black man, his INFERIOR competitor, that the gulf between the two will forever remove the negro as a disturbing factor, either politically or socially.





A few years ago, the Democrats and (especially) Robert C. Wickliffe of this, the Sixth Congressional District, as recreant to their trust for supporting the exorbitant tariff schedule on lumber. We oppose the tariff system: firstly, because the laboring class cannot escape the tax, the tariff being imposed upon the numerous articles consumed by the farmer; secondly, cause such a tariff affords a protection to the home manufacturer, gives him a monopoly of the American market, and with this governmental given favor enables him to wring from the rest of his countrymen an annual dividend of two thousand million dollars. We oppose the tariff on the ground also that the American spinner, holding a monopoly of the market, limits the purchasing power of the people, and thus creates a deplorable system which sends abroad the bulk of our cotton crop.

"We thus take a step further and condemn our international commercial system for two reasons, viz.: Firstly, we should serve the American farmer (or laborer) with the product of his toil before serving Europe and the Orient; secondly, because the system breeds a heavy annual loss to the cotton producer.

"The year 1907 may be taken as a fair example. We exported upwards of 9.000,000 bales of cotton, for which we were paid approximately \$500,000,000, or \$55 per bale. The foreign spinner, after converting the cotton into cloth, sold it for fourteen hundred million dollars-a profit of \$900,000,000. Our system provides that from each bale of cotton exported there must be a deduction of twelve pounds for tare. This loss on the nine million bales exported, at ten cents per pound, amounts to \$11,000,000. So we have an annual loss to the farmers of \$911,000,000.

There was Rabbi Wise New York, one of several Jews; Dennis McCartney and Miss Mary Boyle O'Rellly of Boston, Roman Catholics, and forty Protestant clergymen, Unitarians, Baptists, Presbyterians, Congregationalists and Methodists. out-and-out Socialists there were numerous representatives, including and Mrs. J. G. Phelps-Stokes, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Hunter and Prof. and Mrs. Charles Zuebin, of Boston, There were present also editors of several religious papers, including "The Congregationalist," of Boston; "The Watchman," the "Baptist Weekly," of Boston; "The Westminster," of Philadelphia; "The Christian Endeavor World," of Boston. Practically all the officers of the United Society of Christian Endeavor were on hand, and an array of educators, social settlement workers, labor union leaders and writers that it would take a column to enumerate.

"Half the time of the two daily sessions, for three days, was given to assigned speakers, and then the floor was heard from vigorously. The main topics included a survey of the year's social progress, a review of world-wide social unrest, the negro question, the method of changing from the old social order to a new industrial education and social reconstruction, the cost of crowding women workers, and the social message of the Hebrew prophets.

"The persons handling these themes, in the order given, were: Paul U. Kellog, of the Pittsburg Survey; William T. Ellis, Ray Stannard Baker (these three significantly being newspaper men); Prof. Walter Rauschenbusch, Robert A. Woods, Mrs. Raymond Robins, and Rabbi Stephen S. Wise. From these varied standpoints unity and critical character of the present social needs and ferment of the time were Most of the persons participating are actually engaged in some form of social service. While there were occasionally biting words of disparagement concerning the church's failure to measure up to the new needs of the times, it was generally admitted, even by professed agnostics, that it is with the churches that the future of the social questions lie, provided they awake to the situation in time. The man who was the host of the conference, George W. Coleman, a Boston publisher, has been responsible for the unique Sunday-night services for noncurrent social and religious problems, which have been held for two winters past in Ford Hall.

that the most pronounced and constru tive address upon Socialism was that delivered by Prof. Walter Rauschenbusch of the Baptist Theological Seminary at Rochester. Mrs. Rose Pastor Stokes was overheard to say that it was the best putting of the case of Socialism that ever she had heard. Yet throughout Prof. Rauschenbusch spoke from the standpoint of an orthodox follower of Jesus. His book, "Christianity and the Social Crisis," has of late been reported as the "best seller," by the religious bookstores.

"It is said that the British Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Lloyd George, has been an earnest student of this volume, and that it has been influential, doubtless, in the shaping of the new budget proposals which are so profoundly stirring Great Britain at the present time. Whether it has done all this for a government minister or not, it has done even more radical things for gospel ministers, who have largely used it for sermon material. It is in such ways as this that Christian ministers and teachers are quietly, and almost imperceptibly, capturing the whole social propaganda, and putting it on a Christian basis.

"Among the ministers at the conference were two students of Rauschenbusch who have undertaken to put into practice the theories of their old professor, although Prof. Rauschenbusch is scarcely yet middle. aged himself, and altogether unlike the commonly accepted type of a theologian. The wittiest utterances at the conference fell from his lips. These two young clergymen are Revs. F. W. Pattison and Albert R. Williams of East Boston. They have undertaken the joint pastorate of a Congregational Church which had run down badly, and they are making it a center of social service. The most anomalous fact about the situation is that one of the co-pastors is a Baptist and the other a Congregationalist. Their desire to serve overtops their denominational allegiance.

"These young men are also members of a society which is growing rapidly in influence, "The Brotherhood of the Kingdom." The leading man in this society is the well-known Protestant Episcopal clergyman, Rev. Dr. Leighton Williams, of New York. Meetings are held every summer at Marlboroon-the-Hudson, and the object is the strengthening of the social service idea among the ministers. Whether this body is stronger than the Christian Socialist party it would be difficult to say, especially as it pursues quieter methods of propaganda, and does not seek to draw men from any of their existing allegiances. The Brotherhood of the Kingdom, and what it stands for, have made such progress among the ministers of all names that the conception of the mission of the church may now be said to dominate the re-

though a generation ago it was scarce ly mentioned. Doubtless this is the animating motive in the Federation of Churches, which promises to become the supreme factor in American church





# THE SOCIALISTS' NATIONAL PLATFORM

We herewith republish the Socialists' National Platform, by request of thousands of our readers. The Socialist party has gathered into its fold hundreds of thousands of new converts since the last election, who have never read the Socialists' National Platform, as their prejudice during the last campaign was so strong against Socialism that they had no inclination to read its platform, but seeing their mistake and having become converted to its teachings, they are now anxious to read it, and we take great pleasure in republishing this platform for the benefit of the hundreds of thousands of new converts. It follows:

The Socialist party, in national convention assembled, in entering upon the campaign of 1908, again presents itself to the people as the party of the working class, and as such it appeals for the support of all workers of the United States and of all citizens who sympathize with the great and just cause of labor.

We are at this moment in the midst that periodically paralyze the life of the nation. The much-boasted era of our national prosperity has been followed by one of general misery. Factories, mills and mines are closed, work is abandoned, and millions of men, ready, willing and able to provide the nation with all the necessaries and comforts of life, are forced into idleness and starvation. Within recent times the trusts and monopolies have attained an enormous and menacing development. They have acquired the power to dictate to us the terms upon which we shall be allowed to live. The trusts fix the prices of our bread, meat and sugar; of our coal, oil and clothing; of our raw material and machinery; of all the necessaries of life, and even the prices of our coffins.

The ruling class has seized upon the present desperate condition of the workers as an opportunity for a re newed onslaught on the organized la-

the country have, within the last year, rendered decision after decision depriving the workers of rights which they had won by generations of strug-

The attempt to destroy the Western Federation of Miners, although defeated by the solidarity of organized labor and the Socialist movement, revealed the existence of a far-reaching and unscrupulous conspiracy on the part of the ruling powers against the organizations of labor.

In their efforts to take the lives of the faithful leaders of the miners, the conspirators violated the state laws and the federal constitution in a manner seldom equaled even in a country so completely dominated as in the United States by the profit-seeking class.

The Congress of the United States has shown its contempt for the interests of labor as plainly and unmistakably as have the other branches of government. The legislation, apparently passed for their benefit, has been so distorted as to injure those whom it pretended to help.

The working class of the United States cannot expect any remedy for its wrongs from the present ruling class or from the dominant parties. of one of those industrial breakdowns uals are permitted to use the common its fights for the realization of this ulwith each other, and for the exploitation of their fellowmen, industrial depressions are bound to occur at certain intervals. No currency reform or other legislative measure proposed by capitalist reformers can avail against these fatal results, of a system of utter anarchy in production.

So long as the wealth production of the country is based on individual competition, the fierce struggle of this competition will inevitably lead to combinations and trusts. No amount of government regulation, or of publicity, or of restrictive legislation will arrest the natural course of modern industrial development.

In the maintenance of class government, both the Democratic and Republican parties have been equally guilty. The Republican party has had control of the national government, and has been directly and actively responsible for these wrongs. The Democratic party, while saved from direct responsibility by its political impotence, has shown itself equally subservient to the aims of the capitalist class whenever and wherever it has been in power. The old chattel slave owning aristocracy of the South, which was once the backbone of the Democratic party, has been supplanted by a child-slave plutocracy. In the great cities of our country, the Democratic party is allled with the criminal element of the slums, as the Republican is allied with the predatory crowds of the palace, or with the Republican party in maintaining the interest of the possessing class.

The various "reform" movements and parties which have sprung up within recent years, are but the clumsy expression of widespread popular discontent with the present system of exploitation and graft. They are not based on an intelligent understanding of the historical development of civilization and of the economic and political needs of our time. They are bound to perish as the numerous middle class reform movements of the past have perished.




