EDITORIAL ETCHINGS.

Comrade Berger's statesmanly comment on the Socialist campaign in New York is not to be lost on the party, it appears. Already it has been discussed both favorably and unfavorably. So long as it is discussed at all, good will be had from it.

The St. Louis Labor endorses Comrade Berger's stand and says the New York comrades should take their lesson with resignation. On the other hand, mainly in his Toledo Socialist, with characteristic malevolence, launches a double column scold at Berger and fanatically calls on the bats of impossibility to come down from the belfry of ignorance and help on a new heresy hunt.

Local Carmody, Minn., consists of comrades who have the nobleness to admit a mistake when they make one. Under misleading information they passed resolutions in support of the disruptionists in that state. Now, being better informed, they have passed another set of resolutions confessing the mistake and expressing regret.

On Tuesday the notorious David Goldstein of Boston made a vulgar attack on Socialism and referred to the bad break Debs had made on the union question. He was answered by Comrade Berger.

The debate was filled with repartee, Comrade Berger sallies calling forth laughter by their ready wit. As he took his seat, Delegate Frank Foster, a notorious Boston labor fakir of long standing, shouted: "Socialism has two arms, both left."

Comrade Max Hayes (of the Printers) took a hand in the debate. He said: "I did not know that Socialism was on trial until I heard the gentlemen from Boston (Goldstein). I am willing to hear discussions from all delegates on Socialism. I am proud of the fact that I am a Socialist."
