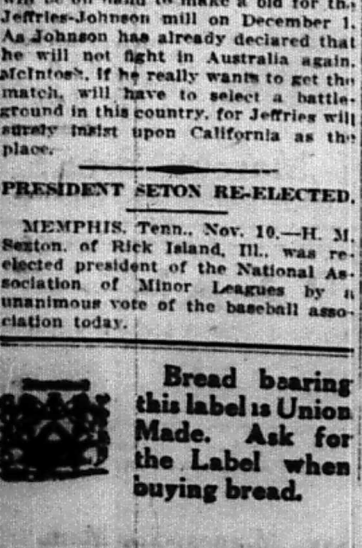
MINTOSH WANTS BIG FIGHT.

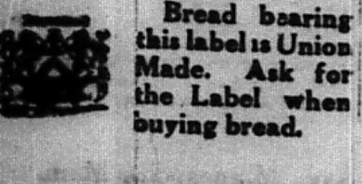
