









CHICAGO UNIONS BACK TO SOCIALIST PAPER

Organization of Labor to Raise \$25,000 for the Daily World.

(Special to The Call.) CHICAGO, July 24.—Recognizing the supreme value of a great newspaper owned and controlled by the working men and women of Chicago, the Chicago Federation of Labor has passed a resolution calling upon its affiliated unions to contribute approximately \$25,000 to the support of the World, the Socialist morning paper published daily, by levying an assessment of 10 cents per member. The resolution was presented by the delegates representing the Carpenters' Local 14 and was adopted with only two dissenting votes, amid great cheering and enthusiasm.

The board also recommended that the union take part in the Labor Day parade. After some discussion it was adopted and referred back to the board. An appeal from the union men and Socialists of San Diego was read and \$10 donated to the defense of the men now in jail in defense of liberty and free speech.
