

'CONGRESS' REPUTATED
Proceedings of the International Socialist Congress.

Rebuke to the Ministerialists at Amsterdam—Text of the Various Resolutions Debated—The Arguments of Bebel and Jaures—Uncompromising Revolutionary Tactics Upheld.

The following partial report of the work of the International Socialist Congress, which convened at Amsterdam, was sent to the New York Workers' Bulletin by Alverton Lee, who represented the Socialist party of America at that congress.

Amsterdam, Aug. 20.—Undoubtedly the most important act of the International Congress was the adoption, last evening, of the report of the Commission on International Relations of the Socialist Party.

THE KAUSKY RESOLUTION.
The subject to be remembered, was taken up by the Paris Congress of 1900, which adopted what is commonly called the Kausky Resolution in the following terms:

The Congress again declares that the class-struggle forbids any species of alliance with any fraction of the capitalist class.

Admitting, even, that exceptional circumstances may necessitate conditions (but only such as do not involve confusion of program or of tactics), these conditions, which the party must seek to reduce to the minimum and finally to eliminate altogether, can be tolerated only in so far as their necessity is recognized by the regional or national organization to which the groups engaged in them may belong.

THE DRESDEN RESOLUTION.
The Congress of the German Social Democracy held in Dresden last September, by an overwhelmingly large vote, after full and free discussion, adopted very strong resolutions in opposition to revisionism.

THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES.
The two votes of the United States, one for each party, were cast together, as need hardly be said, against the Vandervelde-Adler substitute and for the Commission's report.

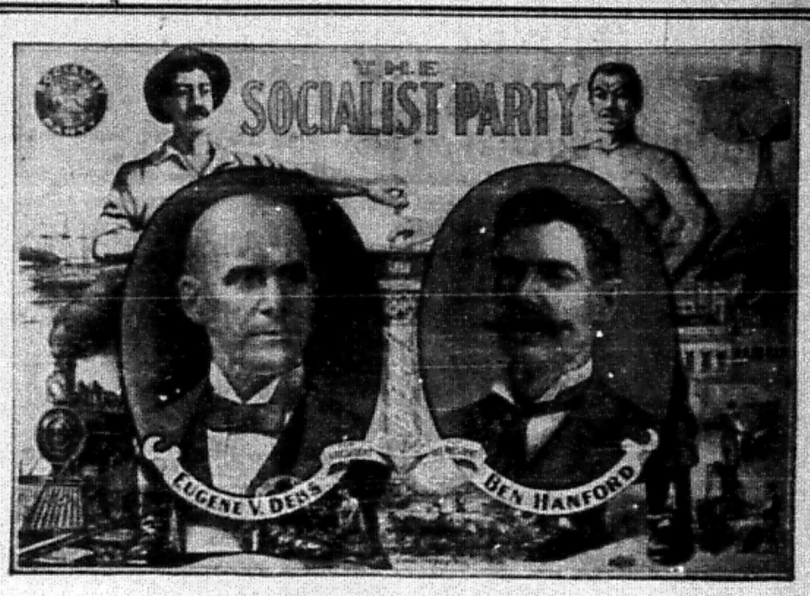
