# S.A. HEADS FOR NEW CRISIS

# Government Shaken By People's Determination

ONCE AGAIN, BECAUSE THE NATIONALIST GOVERNMENT OF DR. VERWOERD REFUSES TO MAKE A SINGLE CONCESSION TO THE OPPRESSED PEOPLE, SOUTH AFRICA IS HEADING TOWARDS A CRISIS.

Support for the anti-apartheid demonstrations at the end of May continues to grow. Last week-end at Afrika Day meetings in all centres thousands of people pledged to take part in the demonstrations if the Government refused to call a national convention of all races to draw up a new constitution for South Africa.

• Meanwhile the indications are that the Government plans to act quickly in an attempt to nip the people's plans in the bud. A NEW WAVE OF ARRESTS AND RAIDS CAN BE EXPECTED AT ANY TIME.

■ Last week both the Prime Minister, Dr. Verwoerd, and the Minister of Justice, Mr. Erasmus, acknowledged that the situation was serious and warred that they were prepared to take drastic action if necessary. Verwoerd went further and threatened to muzzle the opposition press.

■ Last Saturday Die Burger, in its main news atory on the front page headed "Non-Whites incited to action," quoted extensively from Chief Lutuli's Afrika Day message and also from last week's issue of New Age. On Monday of this week, Die Burger followed this up with a leading article warning that the activity of "enemies" both inside and outside the country was precipitating "altogether the most serious crisis in South African history... not in the undefined future but in the next couple of menths."

In this tense atmosphere, the South African Peace Council has issued a last-minute appeal to the Government to avoid internal strife by entering into immediate negotiations with the people's leaders. (See page 3.)

# SOVIET SPACEMAN SHOWS THE WAY

"It is the White man to whom all the progress must be ascribed of which people all over the world at present boast and in which all participate, White and Non-White, and from which the freedom of all of them has sprung."—The Prime Minister, Dr. H. F. Verwoerd, speaking in Parliament on March 23, 1961.

OUR Prime Minister was once a professor at Stellenbosch, but in making the above statement he reveals either his ignorance or his dishonesty.

Modern civilisation is not the product of the White man alone. People of all races and all countries have contributed to it through the centuries. In mathematics, medicine, astronomy (to mention only a few branches of science), the contributions of Non-White scientists, especially in the earlier centuries of their development, were of decisive importance.

The first man was put into space last week by the combined effort of the White and Non-White scientists of the Soviet Union, who enjoy an equal status.

Yet Verwoerd, with epoch-shaking events taking place on all sides of him, still clings to the outmoded ideas of the ox-wagon era. To him, the freedom enjoyed by some of the former colonial countries today was the gift of the White man.

If that is true (which of course it isn't) why does Verwoerd

find it so hard to grant the gift of freedom to his own Non-White peoples?

Of course the opposite is the case. The White man in South Africa (or to be more precise, the Government which rules in his name) is cursed throughout the world for denying freedom to its Non-White citizens.

## "Peaceful Co-Existence"

In the same debate Verwoerd issued an "appeal to the Non-Whites of South Africa, to every group of them, not to believe that South Africa and its Government do not want to be the protector of their rights. In fact it is the fundamental policy of this Government and of the voters of South Africa that each of them should have the right to govern their own racial area or racial group, when they have developed to that stage . . . It is our object to have co-existence, not domination."

"Co-existence" is Verwoord's new fancy phrase for apartheid! Defending his rule, Verwoord boasts that the Africans in South Africa are better-paid, better-educated, more advanced than in any other part of Africa. Yet, while the (in his opinion) less developed peoples of Ghana, Guinea etc. are free to enjoy their independence, he continues to deny all rights to the South African Africans, despite their higher level of development.

In "their own racial areas," such as Pondoland, Tembuland, Zeerust and Sekhukhuneland, far from enjoying self-government, the Africans find themselves ruled by force by White soldiers and police acting under emergency decrees sanctioned by a Parliament of Whites only. Despite the fact that De Wet Nel recently proclaimed that "order" had been restored in Pondoland, hundreds of detainees still rot in the jails.

THIS IS THE REALITY OF VERWOERD'S "CO-EXISTENCE."

In this space age, with man standing on the brink of great new voyages of discovery among the stars, and with the Afro-Asian peoples marching towards freedom and independence with giant strides, Verwoerd and White supremacy are an anachronism—sordid, brutal and completely out of date.

#### An Inspiration

The achievements of free peoples everywhere must be an inspiration and a stimulus to us in South Africa to make a tremendous effort to break the fetters which chain us to the past. Verwoerdism, colour bars and racism must be outlawed from our way of life just like witchcraft, sorcery and all the other mumbo-jumbo of mediaeval superstition.

The Non-White peoples of our country must be freed to take their rightful place in the world, to acquire knowledge and skills like other free peoples, to make their full contribution to the civilisation of the space age, and to enjoy its fruits. The scientists, engineers and technicians of which our country stands in such great need today can be trained in vast numbers from amongst the ranks of our Non-Whites. Once the race barriers are down,

the way will be opened to a life of abundance for all.

Today, with a Soviet man in orbit, all can see that the greatest stumbling block to our national development is Verwoerd and the colour bar. Then let us have done with them, once and for all. Let us put an end to race hatred and divisions. Let us, Black and White together, unite and fight to rescue our country from the sterility and backwardness to which it is doomed by Ver-woerdism. Let us hasten to rejoin the mainstream of humanity flooding ever more rapidly towards a glorious future for all the peoples of the world.

All natios, even the most backward, have te capacity to achieve scientic wonders but it is only undr socialism that these potentialitis can develop to their fullest e-tent, says Khruschov.



# Fuel

Passenger rockets have not yet been built. The main difficulty is loading the rocket with sufficient fuel at the start for its flight, and also for braking on landing. No doubt this problem will be

For a rocket to reach any part of the world, its range must obvi-ously be half the earth's circum-But if we look at the map of the Northern hemisphere, it will

be seen that, starting from Europe half that range will be quite suffi-cient for most flights. The range of the Soviet rockets launched to the Pacific was in fact

more than half. rocket of this range would be able to reach 80 per cent of the popu-lated places on all continents, with the exception of uninhabited AntA passenger rocket could, for instance, travel from Moscow to New York in 1½ hours, and, if required, stop at London on the way, which would only add 15

minutes to the travelling time. Let us imagine how such an in-tercontinental flight would be made. The path followed by the rocket would form an ellipse. The greater the distance between the point of departure and the desti-

nation, the longer the ellipse.
Rockets would leave the cosmodrome vertically, regardless of the direction or distance of their destination. This is mainly in order to pass through the denser layers of the atmosphere as quickly as possible. The rocket would turn on its course at quite a low altitude

#### Rocket Train

The most suitable rocket for long-range flights is the multi-stage rocket or, as Konstantin Tsiolkovsky called it, the rocket-train, consisting of two or more smaller rocket units.

Suppose we are travelling non-stop from Moscow to New York by six-stage rocket. The first stage Prof. A. STERNFELD

gives the rocket a speed of 4,500 m.p.h. and takes it to a height where air resistance is insignificant. Nineteen miles up, the first stage is dropped and the second, then third-stage rockets come into action to give the necessary speed

of 15,000 m.p.h.
One hundred and seventy miles up, the motors are switched off and the rocket continues its fight by inertia, like the shell fired from a gun. Its speed gradually dimin-

At a height of just over 300 miles it is travelling at 13,500 m.p.h., and at twice that altitude at 12,000 m.p.h. Finally, at the "ceiling" of 775 miles, the rocket speed is at its

lowest—11,000 m.p.h.

The travellers will have a magnificent view of the earth. As the rocket climbs they will see in-creasing areas of the earth's sur-face not only on the side of their destination, but on the other side from Moscow.

When the rocket is one-third of the way to New York the outlines of the Ural range will be visible

with binoculars.

will be visible, and the horizon

# TRANSKEI CHIEFS HIT BANTU EDUCATION

Their Children Suffering Like All The

#### PORT ELIZABETH.

AT a meeting held recently in the Rotary Hall at Umtata, Kaiser Matanzima, chairman of the Transkei Territorial Authority, surprised everybody by launching a vicious attack on Bantu Education, and demand-ing that English should be the medium of instruction while Afrikaans and African languages should be taught as subjects.

"Wonder of wonders" some of the

"Wonder of wonders" some of the people who heard him speak said as they left the hall.

The meeting had been arranged by Mr. Hans Abraham, the Commissioner-General although he was not there in person. Complaints and questions had been put to him by the policemer-chiefs about the manner in which Bantu Education was being implemented, It is widely felt that through Bantu Education many children are being denied an opportunity to acquire education.

#### WEEDING-OUT

The chiefs complained that the weeding out that takes place at the Standard 2 level condemned thou-

Standard 2 level condemned thousands of children at an early age to life outside school. They complained even more bitterly against the bottle-neck at Standard 6.

According to the present arrangement standard 6 passes are graded 1st. 2nd and 3rd. Those who pass 3rd grade are issued leawing certificates which merely indicate, if an employer should want proof of educational artiamment, that the holder did attempt standard 6.

As a result of this grading hun-dreds of pupils are denied the opportunity to proceed to Justice Certificate. And the children of the chiefs and stooges have been hit as hard as anybody ke Furthermore, because the Chiefs are in a better financial position to

are in a better financial position to provide for post-primary education for their children, they are not pre-pared to accept a position in which their own children too are con-demned to work as unskilled labourers in the mines, on the roads

CONFINED

They were also informed that they had to remain on the premises, because if they were arrested out-side their employer would not be responsible. The men are therefore confined to the farm.

Mr. Finca did not work only for 6 months on this farm, as arranged. Instead, he worked a whole year without being registered, and then he was dismissed.

He, too, is now apparently in the area illegally, since he has not been registered. To all intents and pur-poses, he is another outlaw.
